Mnangagwa is the Author of Instability: Chamisa

MDC Alliance Presidential candidate, Nelson Chamisa has accused President Emmerson Mnangagwa of brewing instability in the country by refusing to heed to demands by the opposition to level the electoral playing field with the assistance of the Zimbabwe Electoral Commission. Addressing thousands of party supporters who gathered at the Africa Unity Square after marching to ZEC offices in Harare today, Chamisa said Mnangagwa was conniving with the electoral management body to rig the forthcoming harmonized elections- a move he said is threat to the stability of the country.

"I have told Mnangagwa that you are now authoring instability in this country, you are now causing instability in this country, because rigging of elections is causing instability. If you steal elections there will not be peace in the country, "Our ballot is a security issue, elections is a national security issue, respect the people of Zimbabwe," said Chamisa.

Chamisa threatened to cause unrest in the country if ZEC and



Mnangagwa do not agree with his demands for electoral reforms, among them a clean voter's register and transparency on the printing, storage and distribution of the ballot papers.

Political parties have publicly complained against ZEC which they accused of selling them a dummy when they were invited to observe ballot printing at Fidelity Printers 'only to be kept 20 metres away from the printing room.'

"So we will not compromise on the issue of the ballot. We have submitted our concerns to Southern African Development Community (SADC), African Union

(AU), and United Nations (UN), if they fail to give us response, we will become our own answer," said Chamisa.

The MDC Alliance leader further threatened to mobilize the masses to come and stay in the capital if ZEC refuses to give in to their demands.

The peaceful electoral protest also received an endorsement from This Flag founder and cleric, Evan Mawarire among other political stakeholders who rallied people to be firm in their demands for an electoral level playing field.

Family Planning Uptake Still Low in Southern Zim

Zimbabwe will soon meet its Family Planning 2020 (FP2020) target despite southern parts of the country still recording low Contraceptive Prevalence Rate (CPR) compared to Harare and Bulawayo.

Family Planning 2020 (FP2020) is a global partnership that supports the rights of women and girls to decide, freely, and for themselves, whether, when, and how many children they want to have.

Addressing the media yesterday ahead of the World Population Day Commemorations, Zimbabwe National Family Planning Council (ZNFP) Executive Director Dr Munyaradzi Murwira said Zimbabwe is almost reaching the UNFPA 2020 Family Planning (FP) target though there are differentials across the country with the southern provinces recording the lowest uptake of family planning.

"The use of family planning by place of residence, total is 66% but urban areas have a higher prevalence rate than rural areas. Urban areas are at 71% and rural areas at 63%,"

"The differentials across the provinces in terms of the uptake of family planning services, Bulawayo and Harare have the highest CPR of 70-71% and you note that the provinces in the southern parts of the country that is Mani-



caland, Masvingo, Matebeleland South have the lowest use of contraception in the country," explained Murwira.

He added that the southern provinces have a low uptake of family planning because of lower primary healthcare services, high movement of male population to Botswana and South Africa and social, cultural and religious issues.

However, an improvement has been noted in the use of implants from 3% in 2010 and to 10% by 2015.

Speaking at the same briefing, (UNFPA) Zimbabwe Country Representative, Esther Muia said family planning is a key pillar to ensure safe motherhood.

She added that pregnancy and childbirth related complications are the number one killers of girls

aged 15-19.

"Family planning is a human right, it is not about limiting couples but allowing them the choice on when to have children. Family planning is essential to overcoming poverty, which worsens when individuals cannot choose the size of their family,

"It is a key pillar to ensure safe motherhood, reduces the risk of death and disability associated with from pregnancy and childbirth too early or too late in a woman's life as is the situation in Zimbabwe. We need to invest more in our young people to have a brighter Zimbabwe," she said.

Muia urged men to actively participate in family planning and plan together with their spouses.

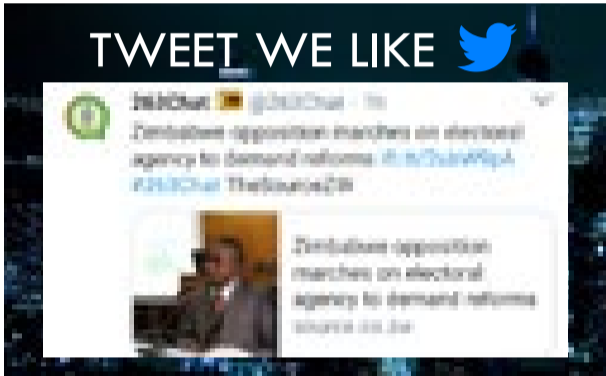

Munch Zimbabwe Delivers Food to Victoria Falls

Munch Zimbabwe, a web-based platform and mobile application that allows people to search for their favourite restaurant and make payments is eyeing expansion into the resort town of Victoria Falls.

Chief Executive Officer of the start-up company, Tatenda Jakarasi said they identified Victoria Falls because of growth prospects as well as filling a gap as most restaurants do not do deliveries. Munch Zimbabwe currently delivers for Little Monkey and Shearwater Cafe among other restaurants in Harare.

"We are delighted to have a presence in Victoria Falls. The city is poised for tremendous commercial growth and it was important for us to bridge the gap between customers and restaurants; the majority of which don't do any deliveries. We'll be adding more restaurants in the coming weeks," said Jakarasi.

Since its launch last year, Munch Zimbabwe has made ordering food convenient for its customers



giving them the option to order through the app, place orders through the website getmunched.com or via their Facebook page, Munch Zimbabwe. Once an order has been made via Ecocash, Zipit or point of sale machines, the restaurant prepares food which customers can either collect in person or is delivered.

"Once an order has been made through the app, Munch drivers will pick the food up from the restaurant and deliver it to the customer. Customers can also place orders in advance for pickup," noted the company. Munch is the only food delivery app in Zimbabwe, operating daily from 10am to 8pm and has

gone on to partner with 50 restaurants in Harare.



Fastjet to launch daily flights between Harare and Bulawayo

...First flight scheduled for 20 July

Fastjet, Africa's affordable airline for everyone, announced today that it will commence daily flights between Harare and Bulawayo from 20 July 2018. Ticket sales are already open on fastjet.com, Fastjet shops and all travel agents, with a special Launch Fare starting at \$59 taxes included.

Fastjet will be the first affordable airline to operate the Harare Bulawayo route; the airline presently flies between Harare and Johannesburg 4 times daily, between Harare and Victoria Falls twice daily and up to 3 times a week between Victoria Falls and Johannesburg.

"Fastjet has been pursuing this route designation for several years," says Fastjet chief executive Nico Bezuidenhout.

"We are delighted to see that positive changes in the Zimbabwean environment made this development possible, enabling low-fare connectivity between more domestic destinations."

Fastjet will celebrate its third year of Zimbabwean operations in October and "has invested substantially in the market with positive outcomes. While we are launching with a single frequency at present, Fastjet intends to further grow the route following further consultation with stakeholders and ultimately to introduce addi-



tional aircraft to facilitate growth," he adds.

Bulawayo being the second largest city in Zimbabwe and a strategic economic hub that services nearby mining, industrial and agricultural activity, Bezuidenhout believes that Fastjet's entry into this market will contribute positively in terms of further stimulating economic activity and growth. The 2017 ICAO (International Civil Aviation Organisation) study shows that aviation creates substantial up and downstream economic benefits. The air transport industry employs around 381 000 people in Africa and contributes more than \$ 9 billion to the continent's GDP.

"The catalytic impact of aviation stretches this to around 6.8 million jobs and \$ 72.5 billion toward GDP. On a country and city scale airlines benefit local tourism, supply chain procure-

ment and on average the market entry of a carrier on any new route stimulates job creation of around 100-200 opportunities across various sectors."

With the addition of the Harare Bulawayo route Fastjet's network in Zimbabwe now totals 4 destinations with more than 100 weekly flights; this makes Fastjet the leading carrier in Zimbabwe.

"With our affordable fares, multiple daily frequencies for business travelers, our commitment to promoting local and inbound tourism and our on-time performance of 90%, Fastjet has become the airline for everyone," says Bezuidenhout.

Zim Prisoners in Long Wait Over Voting Fate

HIGH Court Judge Justice Clement Phiri on Wednesday 11 July 2018 reserved judgment after presiding over the hearing and determination of an application filed by some prisoners seeking an order compelling Zimbabwean authorities to allow them to cast votes in this month's general elections.

Through the application, the prisoners Tungamirai Madzokere and Last Maengahama, wanted the High Court to issue an order compelling Justice, Legal and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Hon. Ziyambi Ziyambi, Zimbabwe Electoral Commission (ZEC) Chairperson Justice Priscilla Chigumba and ZEC as the elections management body, to register them on the national voters roll and facilitate their voting on Election Day.

Madzokere and Maengahama are currently serving prison terms of 20 years each at Chikurubi Maximum Security Prison after they were convicted in 2016 for murdering a policeman. Yvonne Musarurwa, who was also a prisoner until she was released under an amnesty early this year, is the third applicant.



But Justice Phiri reserved judgment after indicating that he would need more time to consider all the legal authorities referred to by lawyers representing the applicants and those representing the defendants before makes a decision "expeditiously". The prisoners' application was only been set down for hearing this month although they filed their petition in June 2017, more than one year ago.

In their application, Madzokere, Maengahama and Musarurwa, who were represented by Advocate Tererai Mafukidze, who was instructed by Jeremiah Bamu of Zimbabwe Lawyers for Human Rights, argued that since the period that they have been in

prison detention, ZEC had neither carried out any voter education, including voter registration nor enabled prisoners to cast their vote during the several by-elections which were held in the country to elect legislators.

The prisoners argued that they were asserting their constitutional rights particularly the right to vote in elections and referendums as enshrined in Section 67 (3) (a) of the Constitution.

Musarurwa, Madzokere and Maengahama argued that it is common cause that Zimbabwe is due for general elections in 2018 and they are entitled to exercise their political rights regardless of their status as detainees.

Econet Infrastructure Investment Sets Building Blocks For Digital Transformation

A postal and telecommunications sector performance report has shown Econet Wireless leading in the information, communication technology (ICT) industry infrastructure investment.

The report, unveiled by the Postal and Telecommunications Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe (Potraz) on Monday reveals that as at the end of the March 2018, Econet had 52% market share of 2G base stations, ahead of its mobile sector peers NetOne, which had 35% market share, and Telecel, which had 14%.

The report by the industry regulator revealed that in the 3G data technology category, Econet had an even larger infrastructure market share of 57%, in comparison to NetOne, which had 28%, and Telecel, which managed a 15% market share.

The sector report showed a yet wider lead in high-speed LTE data technology investment by Econet in comparison to its peers, with the company garnering 68% market share, ahead of NetOne – at 30% – and Telecel at 2%.

Econet, which celebrates its 20th anniversary this week, commenced operations on July 10, 1998.

The company has since grown to be the industry market leader, with a 65% overall customer market share of active mobile subscribers, according to the industry report.

By comparison, Econet's licensed peers NetOne and Telecel – which both begun operations



before Econet – were shown with 23% (NetOne) and 12% (Telecel) market share at the end of the first quarter of 2018.

Listed less than a year after it commenced operations, Econet Wireless is now firmly established as a listed blue-chip company and one of the Zimbabwe Stock Exchange's heavy weight counters, attracting interest from both local and international investors. The Potraz sector report showed that Econet was the only operator in Q1 of 2018 that grew its mobile data traffic share, from 64.6% to 67.1%. NetOne's mobile data traffic share fell from 29.2% to 27.8%, while Telecel's data traffic share dropped from 6.2% to 5.1%.

Taken together with its significant and consistent investment in network and data infrastructure, the evidence from the report suggests that Econet has earned its market leadership stripes, as its infrastructure gives it the capacity to

add new customers, drive subscriber usage and to offer multiple products and services – in particular multimedia content and fintech products – which run on data-driven digital platforms. The data from the Potraz report affirmed that Econet's customer and product market leadership is supported by multi-million-dollar infrastructure investment (over US\$1.3 billion over the years), which has allowed Econet to take giant leaps forward on the journey towards transitioning itself into a fully digital business. When Econet customers enjoy the Kwese multi-media products on digital platforms, or when they use services within the business' extensive fintech mobile transacting environment, they hardly link these to the company's extensive infrastructure investment. Yet the two are immutably linked and are in fact at the core of what drives the 20-year old mobile market leader in Zimbabwe.

Zimbabwe's Mobile Internet Data Usage Falls

Zimbabwe's Mobile Internet Data usage has decreased by 0.18% to record 5.22 million Gigabytes in the first quarter of 2018 from 5.23 million consumed in the last quarter of 2017.

The statistics are part of the 2018 first quota performance report released by the Postal and Telecommunications Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe (POTRAZ) on Monday.

According to the report, mobile internet data usage refers to the amount of internet data consumed by a population through the use of mobile devices such as smartphones, tablets and other small devices which can access the Internet via 2G/3G/4G and LTE network setup.

During the presentation of the results, the POTRAZ Director General, Dr Gift Machengete accredited the fall in mobile internet data usage to recent public outcries by mobile network users on the high costs pegged on data bundles by network operators such as Econet, and NetOne.

Dr. Machengete also added that the regulator has moved in to curb the mobile internet data crisis through implementing a new Long Run Incremental Costing model for operators which saw POTRAZ slashing data tariffs by 60% from the recently pegged pricing of 12, 5 cents per megabyte down to 5 cents per mega-



byte.

The mobile network operators have since then complied to the regulator's directive through issuing public notices that they have slashed their out of bundle browsing data packages.

On a positive note, Zimbabwe's international incoming voice traffic increased by 2.4% from 39.7 million minutes recorded in the last quarter of 2017, to 40.6 million minutes in the first quarter of 2018.

This can be accredited to positive responses by the global community to President Emmerson Mnangagwa's economy resuscitation strategy "Zimbabwe Is Open for Business" which has ignited investor interests.

In correspondence to that, Zimbabwe's international outgoing voice traffic registered a 6% growth from 19.5 million minutes recorded in the last quarter of 2017, to 20.8 million minutes in the first quarter of 2018. This is further accredited to massive engagement by the local business players in their bid to lure foreign direct investment through con-

necting with global conglomerates.

POTRAZ also recorded that inbound roaming traffic increased by 10% from 1.6 million minutes recorded in the last quarter of 2017, to 1.8 million minutes in the first quarter of 2018.

Director General – Dr Gift Machengete said this can be complimented by the increasing number of international visitors thronging Zimbabwe for various purposes such as tourism, exploring business opportunities and also observers in the upcoming elections.

In return, Zimbabwe's outbound roaming traffic decreased by 8% to record 741,482 minutes in the first quarter of 2018, from 803,117 minutes recorded in the last quarter of 2017.

This can simply be explained by the number of Zimbabweans who have embraced the use of Over The Top (OTT) services like WhatsApp Calling and Skype when making international calls.

TANTALISING RECIPES

SQUASH AND TURKEY BAKE

NIGEL SLATER

PREP TIME: LESS THAN 30 MINS

COOKING TIME: 1 - 2 HOURS

SERVES: 4

Nigel Slater swaps traditional shepherd's pie ingredients for turkey and butternut squash, with delicious results.

Ingredients:

- a medium-sized butternut squash
- a little olive oil
- a large onion
- a large clove of garlic
- 15 chestnut mushrooms
- 3 sprigs thyme
- 500g/1lb 2oz minced turkey
- salt and freshly ground black pepper
- a little flour
- 400ml/14fl oz red wine
- a little Worcestershire sauce
- a knob of butter
- a little orange zest

Method:

1. Preheat the oven at 200C/400F/Gas 6. Peel, seed and roughly chop the butternut



squash. Put the pieces of squash in a steamer basket and place over boiling water. Steam for 20-30 minutes until fully tender. They must be soft enough to mash.

2. Peel and roughly chop the onion. Peel and finely slice the garlic. Warm a couple of tablespoons of the olive oil in a large pan, then add the onion and garlic and cook until pale gold. Cut the mushrooms into thick slices or quarters and add to the pan with the leaves from the thyme sprigs. Fry until softened, then transfer to a mixing bowl.

3. Add a further tablespoon of oil to the pan, then, as soon as it starts to sizzle, add the minced turkey. Season generously with

salt and pepper and then stir in a couple of heaped tablespoons of flour. Cook for 2-3 minutes, then pour in the red wine and a few shakes of Worcestershire sauce. Simmer at a low temperature for 5 minutes then add the mushrooms and onions. Continue cooking for 5 minutes then tip into a baking dish.

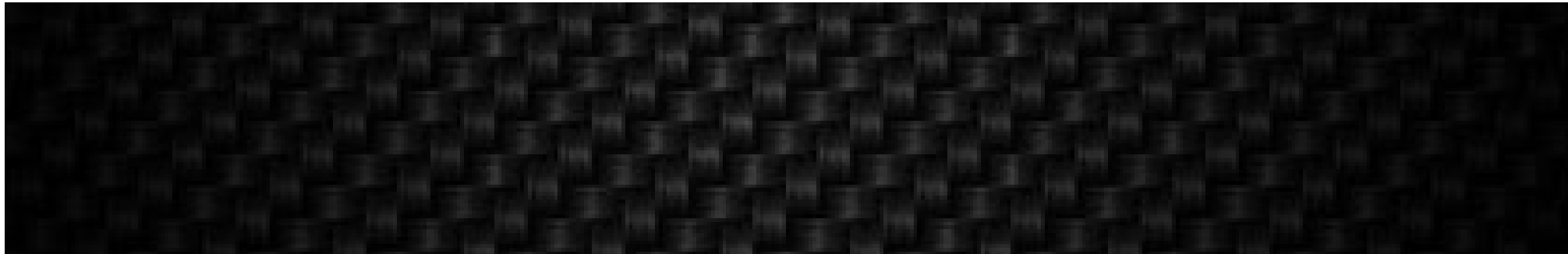
4. Mash the cooked squash with a potato masher then stir in a generous knob of butter and the grated orange zest, to taste. Season with salt and pepper.

5. Pile the mash on top of the turkey, dot with more of the butter, then bake for 35-45 minutes, or until the mash is lightly browned and slightly crisp on top.

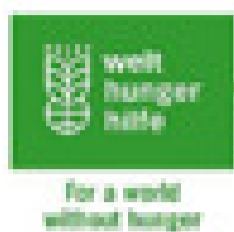

Injury Rules Mire Out of ODI Series Against Pakistan

Solomon Mire has been ruled out of Zimbabwe's one-day international (ODI) series against Pakistan, starting this Friday in Bulawayo, due to injury.

The 28-year-old explosive batsman sustained a gluteal tear last Friday during his magnificent innings of 63 versus Australia in the Twenty20 international (T20I) triangular series at Harare Sports Club.

Two days earlier, he had plundered a brilliant 94 – now the highest score by a Zimbabwe batsman in T20I cricket – against Pakistan.

Team physiotherapist Anesu Mupotaringa said Mire will be out of action for at least three weeks. "He will be out for at least three weeks as he concentrates on physiotherapy rehabilitation which aims to speed up healing and make sure the tear heals without tight scar tissue formation," Mupotaringa said.

Apart from Mire, Zimbabwe will also miss the services of fast bowler Kyle Jarvis, who is out for at least six weeks after he fractured his right thumb while field-



ing during the triangular series.

In the absence of the duo, Zimbabwe will be banking on the experience of captain Hamilton Masakadza, Elton Chigumbura, Chamu Chibhabha, Malcolm Waller and the returning Tendai Chatara when they take on Pakistan in the five-match ODI series. Peter Moor, Tarisai Musakanda and Brian Chari will be eager to impress with the bat, while pace bowler Blessing Muzarabani will be expected to have a big say with the ball, alongside spinners Tendai Chisoro and Wellington Masakadza.

Former Zimbabwe Under-19 captain Liam Roche, Tinashe Kamunhukamwe and Ryan Murray have

been included in the squad and are in line for their debuts.

The ODI series gets underway this Friday at Queens Sports Club, with the rest of the matches scheduled for 16, 18, 20 and 22 July at the same venue.
